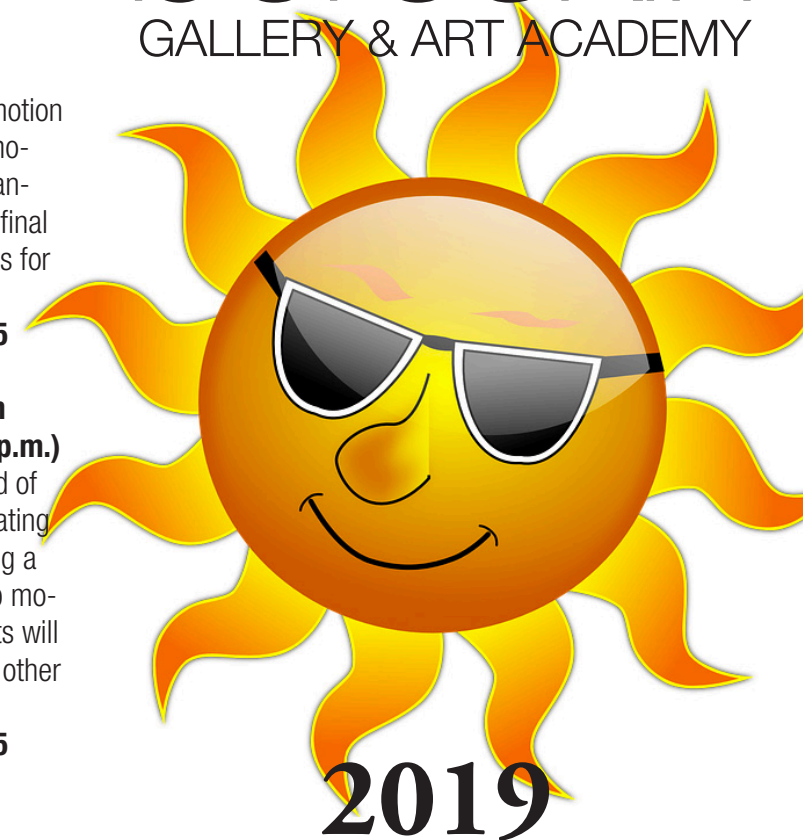
DA101 - Creating a Successful Painting
